President's Message

Dear Alumni Community,

We are an approximately 3,000-strong community of Woodstock alumni, staff, parents and friends bound together by our experience of being nurtured on the Landour hillside. Thanks to the support and commitment of this community, FWS has been able to provide significant financial, administrative and alumni engagement support to Woodstock for over a generation.

Over the past decade we have watched Woodstock thrive and be recognized as one of the leading international schools in Asia. But when a global pandemic blows in fair weather can quickly turn foul, and Woodstock has been confronting a number of unanticipated challenges since COVID disrupted life on the hillside in 2020. As I write this message in May 2021, Woodstock is reeling from the current deadly wave of the COVID crisis that is slamming India. Students that returned to campus in March had to return home in April due to the dramatic spike in cases throughout India from this second wave. A number of staff and employees have tested positive for COVID and some have experienced severe symptoms.

In May FWS approved a \$131,133 emergency grant request from Woodstock seeking funding for equipment and supplies to help combat the COVID outbreak at Woodstock and on the Landour hillside. Supplies needed by Woodstock include several portable isolation cabins, COVID medical and food kits, oxygen concentrators and cylinders, testing kits and vaccines. A portion of the overall grant, roughly \$30,000 will be used by Woodstock to help fund an emergency triage center at Landour Community Hospital. We have also established a separate Woodstock COVID Relief Fund on the books of FWS to support needs that arise as the School and the local community cope with the ongoing COVID health crisis.

Since our January 2020 in person reunion in Tampa, FWS has made over \$800,000 in grants to Woodstock and to Li-Chu scholars studying in North America. In addition to the recent COVID Relief grant, other large (over \$100,000) grants have been made for High School and Quad Level 3 classroom renovations, and for the completion of the Centre for Imagination (CFI). We have also approved grants to fund scholarships at Woodstock and for eligible Woodstock graduates studying in North America, for cabinets and equipment for the Woodstock Archive Room, equipment and teaching aids for STEM, a portable sound system, a grant to support the Hanifl Centre and the 2020 Mussoorie Mountain Festival, and a grant for the Woodstock Employees Children's Education Fund.

We anticipate a very active period of grant support over the next couple of years in five key areas: COVID Relief, scholarships, advanced certification and professional development for teachers, community engagement, including support for the Kaplani School, and a major renovation of Science Facilities in the High School. None of these grants would be possible without your interest, commitment and generous support. We would be glad to speak with you about any of these programs and projects.

David and Connie Wheeler and those of us on the FWS Board look forward to catching up with many of you on Zoom calls over the next few months and at our next FWS / WOSA Reunion, which we are planning to hold virtually over a 3-day weekend from July 30th through August 1st, 2021.

As always the FWS Board thanks you for your past and continuing support, and would like to hear your ideas and suggestions of ways in which you would like to help us grow as an organization. FWS is committed to serving its members and supporting the school's strategic goals, particularly in challenging times like these.

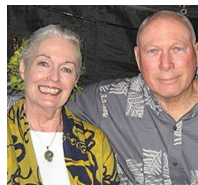
Annual Review Report

The FWS Board of Directors reviews and approves all grants made from its designated and undesignated funds.

Grants made in FY 2019-2020 total \$54,653 consisting of:

Designated Grants

Woodstock School Science, Math, and Computer Departments | \$35,733

In 2020 during the Corona Virus outbreak Friends of Woodstock School was able to remain open under protocols defined in orders issued by the Governor of the State of Washington. 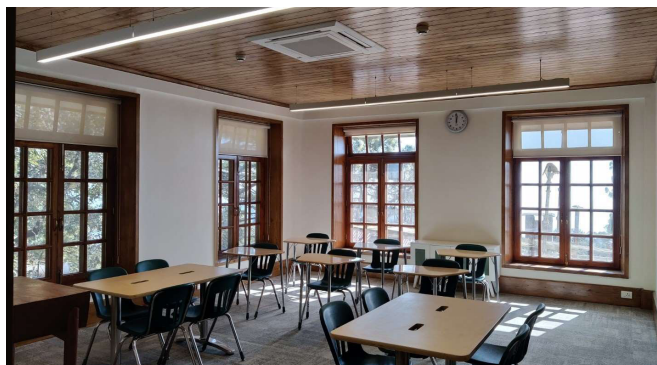

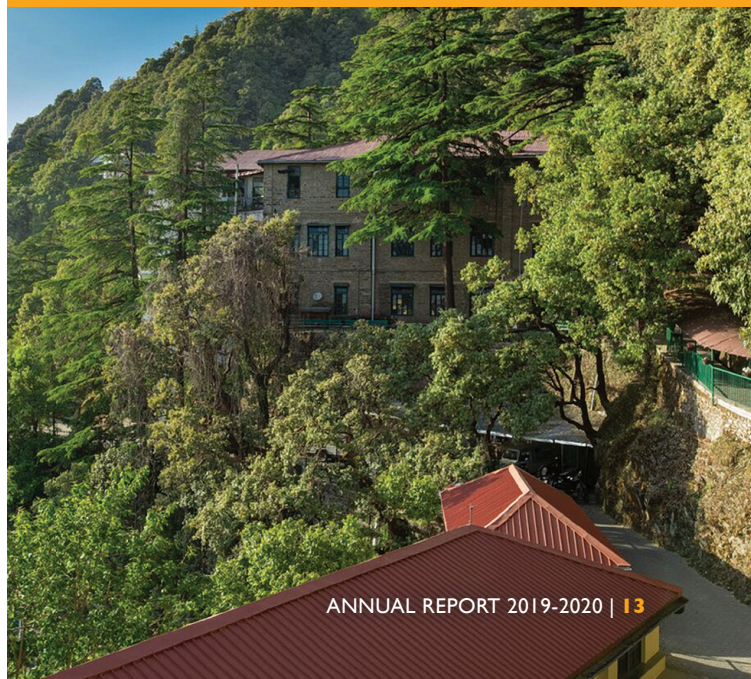

TREASURER'S REPORT

David Schoonmaker stepped off the FWS Board in 2020 and I stepped into his role as Treasurer and Chairperson of the Finance Committee. FWS owes David a debt of gratitude for the time and effort (and expertise) he put into this role for the past ten years.

This past year has been, without a doubt, a memorable year. COVID, of course, colors just about everything we will remember about it and impacted us in ways we did not expect. The market, where we invested more than 6 million dollars, slid precipitously but then recovered and went on to new highs later in the year. Meanwhile, despite the disruption of the virus, giving to FWS by alumni remained pretty much consistent with average donations of past years – around \$200,000. Income from the stock market came to around \$260,000, net of fees.

If you are a numbers person then the summary of expenses can be found in the columns beside this report and our Grants Report. This lists all our grants and scholarships, the bulk of which this past year went to the Center for Imagination and classroom renovations (a number of which were funded by various classes and matched by FWS). For me, fairly new to this position, one of the interesting things is that FWS does not just give to brick and mortar projects at the School. We also give generously to scholarships so worthy students can attend Woodstock or are assisted in attending a university.

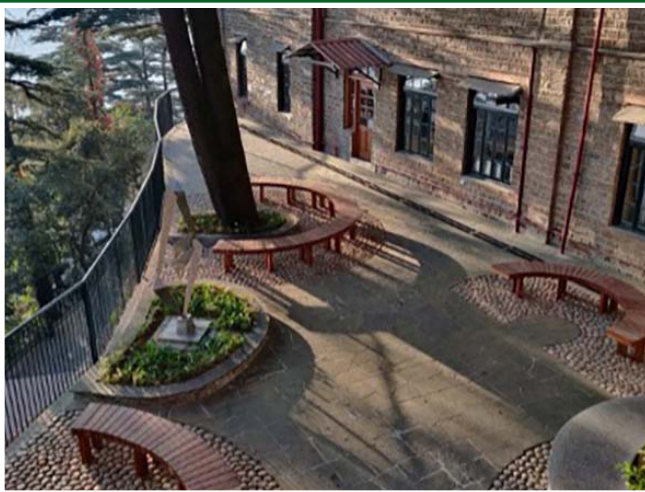
The main task of the Finance Committee, as I see it, is one of stewardship – we pay close attention to our funds in the market, looking for a stable and conservative return. And we also oversee all aspects of accounting of all funds that come in to FWS and all funds that leave. We are well served by a dedicated group of volunteers, all Woodstock grads who meet four times a year by ZOOM and give their expertise, advice and provide oversight. I want to thank David Shastry ('09), Jonlyn Freeman ('91), and Amit Lalvani ('11) for their generous gift of time and knowledge.

Additionally, with general coordination and day-to-day operational oversight, David Wheeler and Connie Wheeler fill an invaluable role from their office on Whidbey Island, WA.

None of this, of course, would be possible if it were not for YOU, my fellow Woodstock-wallahs. We deeply appreciate the depth and breadth of involvement from our alumni base. YOU make all this possible through your gifts, bequests and love for this School. Thanks!
